

Project Rationale



UTM students see significant opportunities to enhance their academic advising experiences.



UTM staff have echoed students, identifying room to improve advising through enhancing: capacity; training; collaboration; and communication



UTM retention and graduation rates

lag behind those for other divisions.

- 6-year graduation rates*:
 - ARTSC 81.5%
 - UTSC 74.0%
 - UTM 69.2%



Student success research consistently points to academic advising as one of the most significant pathways through which institutions may influence students' success and retention.

- academic, personal and career goals;
- campus resources/supports;
- the institutional mission, culture and expectations;
- the curriculum and co-curriculum, their interrelationship and their value;
- the transferability of skills and knowledge; and
- the different ways people think, learn and make decisions.

For the purposes of the project, academic advisors are: *staff* or faculty who, among other responsibilities, are formally charged with helping students with the selection of academic programs and courses.

- enjoy widespread leadership and community support.








